## Certificate in Medical Coding (0563)

### ***What do medical coders do?***

**Medical Coders** review medical records to translate numeric codes for diagnoses and procedures to be utilized by insurance companies for claims processing, billing, and reimbursement for healthcare services. To perform this task, they must possess expertise in the *International Classification of Diseases* and *Current Procedural Terminology* Coding Systems. The Medical Coding Certificate Program is designed to prepare students for entry-level coding positions. Coders are employed in a variety of healthcare settings, both inpatient and outpatient.

### ***What does this education do for me?***

Graduates of the Medical Coding Certificate Program are eligible to sit for the CCA (Certified Coding Associate) examination, a nationally recognized credential sponsored by the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA), 233 N. Michigan Avenue, 21<sup>st</sup> Floor, Chicago, IL 60601-5809, <http://www.ahima.org>, or other professional organizations based on specified requirements. Having this credential can show prospective employers that students possess specialty entry-level coding skills needed to help organizations achieve optimal reimbursement and enhance the quality of patient care.

### ***Is there an admission process?***

The Medical Coding Certificate Program begins once a year during the fall semester. Applications must be received by June 1<sup>st</sup> to be considered for admission into the program.

**For full consideration of admission to the Medical Coding Certificate Program, students must:**

1. Apply and be fully admitted to Albany State University before the admission date for each semester. Due dates for ASU applications are as follows:
  - Fall semester – June 1
  - Spring semester – November 1
  - Summer semester – April 1
2. Have completed all required Learning Support courses (if applicable).
3. Have completed all pre-requisite courses with a “C” or better.
4. Complete a program application & submit it to the Program Director by June 1<sup>st</sup>.
5. Have a minimum GPA of 2.5.
6. Have a computer with accessibility that meets all of the requirements of GeorgiaView. These can be found via <https://www.asurams.edu/distance/orientation/>.

### **Additional Requirements:**

1. To continue in any Health Information Technology program, a “C” is required in all HITE courses. If a student fails to make a “C” or better in any HITE course, and it is the student’s first failure, the student may reapply to the particular Health Information Technology program. All of the student’s previous HITE coursework will be evaluated by the Program Director, and the Program Director will make the decision as to which courses should be repeated. More than one “W”, “D” or “F” in any HITE course will result in permanent dismissal from the program. (This may be two courses or failure in the same course twice).
2. High-speed internet is recommended for optimal use of AHIMA’s Virtual Lab and/or EHRGo applications.
3. Because of the nature of the profession, students are required to sign and abide by a statement to honor the confidential nature of medical records (HIPAA). A charge of breach of confidentiality will be reason for immediate dismissal from the program.

4. Once enrolled in the program, exhibiting unprofessional behavior will result in the student being withdrawn from the program and deemed ineligible for re-admission to the program. Unprofessional behavior is defined as but not limited to:

- misrepresentation of self or falsifying information on the program application
- disruptive or abusive behavior in an online class
- breach of the confidentiality statement and/or
- suspicion of cheating will be dealt with in accordance with the Student Handbook, "Code of Conduct."
