DR. NNEKA NORA OSAKWE

Director, Office of International Education

Dr. Nneka Nora Osakwe is a professor of English and the Director of the Office of International Education at Albany State University (ASU), Georgia, and has been serving in higher education for over 28 years. She leads the ASU internationalization efforts, which ensure high academic quality for students through study abroad, international students' enrollment, curriculum and co-curriculum internationalization, global learning engagements, and international partnerships. She recently initiated the acceptance of ASU as one of eleven intuitions to participate in the American Council on Education (ACE) Internationalization LAB 2018-2020. She developed and led first ASU study abroad programs in China, Peru, and Ghana, and mentors faculty to lead new programs to various countries. Dr. Osakwe is a 2018 recipient of the U.S. Department of Education Undergraduate International Studies and Foreign Language Grant of \$88,000. Her project will foster ASU Pathways to Africa, Asia, The Caribbean, North and South America.

Sherrell Byrd is the founder and chair of the Albany Business League, an organization that supports and empowers African American business owners to reach their next level in business in Albany, Georgia.
